

## **FELIX BECKER**

MONOCHROMATIC MUD SNUFFERS

May 12, 2022 - June 25, 2022

A wooden grasping arm protrudes exploratively from the ceiling of the gallery. Like an oversized trunk or a somewhat clumsy dentist's mirror, it seems to trying to dissect the visitors. Two years ago, Felix Becker began constructing sculptures out of used fruit crates in Marseille.

Whatkind of juxtaposition does one witness here? Perhaps a duel between 'Senfblüte', the small sculpture made of paper, and 'Ceres', the wooden creature reminiscent of an aggressive insect? Although the proportions might indicate the predominating power structure, the situation and the role distribution are by no means obvious. Becker's wooden sculptures appear rough and uneven, their material, dozens of staples, and the glue that holds them together, are clearly visible. Perhaps they are the inspiration for the title-giving 'Snuffer', the junkie who stands in clear contrast to the smooth and monotonous.

In contrast, the application of paint in Felix Becker's impasto painting appears malleable, almost butter-soft. He applies oil paint to his canvases in several layers. At closer examination, a bright color peeps out from under the mostly muted colors, often only visible through a tiny corner. The overlapping color that spills over the edge of the background not only negates the cliché of the monochrome rectangle, it also forms a new structure: the color resides in space. The clean-looking works stand in stark contrast to the sticky oil paints that are smeared onto the canvas layer by layer. Looking closer, their application appears rough and uneven-celebrating the imperfect.


This is accompanied by the artist's striking interventions in the originally smooth surfaces of the paint. They look like churned-up mud, dense clouds of steam, or smoky muddy swamps-breaking with the monochrome. Once again, the artist negates the supposed perfection. The works can not only be viewed, but they actively confront you. Thus they appear not only flat and rigid, but tangible and moving, almost animated. It is as if one can make out the inhabitants of that mud: they arch upwards and provoke moments of disturbance on the canvas.

At this point, at the latest, it becomes clear that we cannot speak of abstract painting here - too many figurative elements predominate: Lines, like limbs, entangled or in struggle. Skeleton-like extremities protrude into the field of vision and formally relate to the artist's sculptures.

Anyone who spends much time in front of Felix Becker's painting knows that it always appears differently in varying incidences of light. Time takes a determining factor in the works. Whether it is the length of time it takes for the countless layers of paint to dry, the spontaneous intuition that leads Becker to break up a seemingly perfect surface, or the chance that ultimately determines the final form of his sculptures. 'Monochromatic Mud Snuffers' shows a play of movement and stillness, an ambivalent stop motion in sculpture and painting.




