HERBERT WARMUTH ON THE EXHIBITION

"I was always a driven man. No sooner had a certain group of works been made, the research on them not even completed, than I already had ideas about other works that I absolutely had to try out to find out what they could mean to me, whether they would convince me, take me further.

In the process, I was always driven by two questions:


What is painting, and especially adequate painting for the times in which I find myself? And what does a painting look like in which I recognize myself as a painter and yet leave the viewer the freedom to arrive at his own ideas and his own view and reading with his own story?

My paintings should touch and establish relationships with the viewer, but always leave him room for his preferences, his feelings and his interpretation. They should offer him the possibility to read them intellectually in the context of other works, but at the same time, despite all the transparency of the production, the way they are made, they should also go beyond the purely conceptual and intellectually understandable in order to surprise - myself included.

When I look at my work today, it seems to me as if I have circled my possibilities once, as if everything is ready, nothing is finished, and so I feel free to continue any work that can be seen in the exhibition, if necessary, to enter again into the investigative search, but under today's guidelines and with other experiences. The exhibition is therefore not meant to be a retrospective. It is rather a personal look at what is essential for me. Just as my paintings are ultimately the results of two questions, the exhibition is an attempt to bring together an idea of my interests and investigations of painting over the last 35 years into one view - for the viewer of the exhibition, but also for me as a painter, who can now look at the individual results together and reflect on quintessence of years of work.

And all at once the pictorial results of being driven seem to me nevertheless all very related, not to say the same. In the end, despite all their differences, all my works have always been about the same thing, and my work continues to be about the same thing. In addition, there are the artist's striking interventions in the originally smooth color surfaces. They look like churning mud, dense clouds of steam, or smoky, muddy swamps - breaking with monochromaticity. Once again, the artist negates supposed perfection. The works can not only be looked at, but they actively confront you. Thus they seem not only flat and rigid, but tangible and moved, almost animated. It is as if one can make out the inhabitants of the mud: they arch upwards and provoke moments of restlessness on the canvas. At this point at the latest, it becomes clear that one cannot speak of abstract painting here - too many figurative elements predominate: Lines, like limbs, entwined or in struggle. Skeleton-like limbs protrude into the field of vision and formally relate to the artist's sculptures.
























Hebert Warmuth Schwarzblau durch Weiß, 2022 Acrylic behind and through plexiglass 50 x 30 cm






Dunkelrot durch Carput mortuum, 2023


